
Our guest speaker and volunteer, Max Harpham, who grew up with profound hearing loss, shared his challenges and success in his hearing journey.



### **Student projects supporting HMA**


This year, HMA partnered with Macquarie University's PACE Linguistic and Media Communication student placements to create impactful content on hearing loss awareness and services.
